Pupil Premium

The government now gives funding to all schools to enhance the learning opportunities for children who are eligible for free school meals at any point in the last 6 years; looked after by the local Authority for more six months; and/or children of service personnel. It is for schools to decide how pupil premium is spent, since they are best placed to assess what additional provision should be made for the individual pupils within their responsibility.

The impact of Pupil Premium spending can, if wisely used, benefit all pupils.
